Hales Corners resident Alyson Dudek made history in 2010 when she became the first Wisconsin athlete to medal in Short Track Speedskating at the Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver. The women's US Short Track Speedskating Team took home the bronze in the 3,000m Relay. The proposed Alyson Dudek International Ice Center will benefit future athletes as they pursue their dreams, and bring back the fun of family recreational skating, as well as other community uses. Our goal is to build a 100' X 200' Olympic-sized, outdoor ice skating rink that will be open to the public in December 2012. Estimated costs for building the rink are \$150,000. With strong community interest in an outdoor facility for residents to enjoy free ice skating and recreation, we can go on to Phase II in 2013, which will include a pavilion and restrooms shown below.
